

1. Heather Talbot Completes her first HIV Seminar

The trainees represent different groups of people in the society and the idea is to help them run HIV sensitisation seminars and campaigns among their own people. It costs us about US\$ 400 to run a seminar for 25 educators and covers food, transportation, manuals, related material... Consider supporting these seminars. The new Centre is only about 100 meters away from the current one and so eases management. However, the total amount of money needed to completely setup the Centre is 3,800,000 FCFA (about \$7,600)

Monday 26th of November 2007



HINT has been selected to participate in Inveneo's ICIP Training Program in Cameroon.

Inveneo creates highly sustainable and affordable ICT infrastructure technologies designed specifically for organizations that provide vital services -- education, healthcare, economic development -- in remote and rural areas in the developing world. Inveneo partners with local ICT companies/organisations in countries it serves around the world to provide skilled and cost effective installation and support

services for clients. These ICT Partners are certified by Inveneo and available to sell. This program is called the Inveneo Certified ICT Partner (ICIP) program. Upon completion of the training, scheduled to run from November 26-December 2, 2007, HINT will become one of Inveneo's in-country certified partners.

24. 16 people receive training and or loans

Tuesday 20th of November 2007



16 people including 14 women and 2 men in Ekona town received training on how to start, run, and grow small businesses for income generation. The one-day seminar took place in Ekona at the Full Gospel Church Hall. At the end of the training, 5 women received loans ranging from 20,000 -75,000 Frs. The loans will enable most of them to buy in bulk, so that they can make more profit that will be used to improve their social and economic conditions. Several other women and groups are

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looking up to us but we are running out of loans. We need you come in so we can help more women.

1. Who We Are

Helps International (HINT) is a community-based non-profit NGO that was founded to help improve on the social and economic well-being and health of the poor through education, skills development, and job creation without discrimination of race, color, religion, political beliefs, gender, national origin, or disability.

2. Our Objectives

- To fight poverty and unemployment by providing marketable skills in ICTs, agriculture, and business set-up & management.
- To provide interest-free loans to jobless and poor youths for business start-ups, thereby reducing unemployment.
- To improve on the health condition of the poor by setting up Health Centres in poor communities.
- To contribute to the fight against the rampant transmission of HIV/AIDS and other STIs through education and development of self-reliant projects for jobless adults, and vulnerable youths.
- To provide education, health care, clothing, and feeding assistance to orphans, street children and very poor children from subsistence farming homes.
- To contribute to community development through projects such as wells, portable water, health units, schools, Electricity...
- To offer emergency relief to victims of natural and/or man-made disasters when need arises.
- To HELP anyone in need whenever we have the resources to.

3. How we are organised

HINT Cameroon is led by an Executive Council comprising an Executive Director who works in close collaboration with an Administrative Assistant, General Secretary, a Treasurer, Financial Secretary, and Communication Manager. A Board of Directors provides overall guidance.

4. Our Projects/Strategies

i. Information & Communication Technologies (ICTs)

- 1. Community ICT Training Centres Provide **access** to and job-oriented **training** in Computers, Internet, secretarial administration, web design, Networking, Computer Maintenance, Desktop Publishing, Photo Editing.
- 2. Computers for Development (ComDev) Provision and installation of Computers in Schools, Community Centres, Non-profits

ii. Education

- 1. Child sponsorship
 - Providing, textbooks, fees, and uniforms to orphans and children from poor families.
- 2. *Community Education Libraries* Ensuring that children in primary and secondary schools have the textbooks they need to be successful in their studies.
- 3. Community Education Centres

Providing orphans and children from poor homes the opportunity to still have a dissent education despite their poor backgrounds.

iii. Health

1. Community Health Centres

Making it possible for the local community to have access to low-cost and affordable health care services.

In the meantime, we run short seminars for young business people.

5. Achievements

- More than 600 youths have been trained since 2003 to be able to effectively use the computer and the internet.
- We currently run 2 IT training centres located in Buea, Cameroon equipped with over 30 computers.
- More than 50 children have been helped to attend school.
- More than 25 unemployed youths have been trained as web designers. With their new skills, they can generate income that will help them overcome poverty in their lives.
- About 12 people have so far received loans for micro-businesses.
- More than 60 community leaders have been trained to become HIV/AIDS Educators within their communities.
- HINT is a certified training partner with Kabissa's "Time to Get Online" Training program. Kabissa is a Washington-based NGO.
- HINT won the Global Junior Challenge competition in 2004 in Rome.
- HINT' was a participant at Africa Source II, which ran from Jan. 8-15, 2006, in Uganda, organized by Tactical Technology, Netherlands.
- HINT's Director is a graduate of the 2006 class of the Global Social Benefit Incubator (GSBI) program at Santa Clara University, USA.
- HINT has been congratulated by Cameroon's Minister of External Relations with a letter dated Jan. 24, 2005 and referenced 000219/DIPL/D3/SDCNG/ONG
